From the Pastor's Desk

My dear Trinity Family,

Let me begin by wishing you a blessed time of following our faithful Lord in the month of March 2017. As we enter the set-apart season of Lent, I am sure many of you are asking, "Lord, what may I do this season to draw all the more closer to you?"

If that is your desire, here are some tips for you:

1. Take time to reflect

How about setting aside a daily time other than your quiet time to reflect upon Jesus' journey to the cross? It could be a quiet space of 10, 15, 30 minutes or even more. You could read the sections in the Gospels and Epistles that set your eyes upon the cross. It adds a lot if you can sing or read a hymn about the cross during the time. And how about adding a time of fasting and prayer into your schedule once a week? It could be that you skip a meal, a snack or a coffee time. For those of us whose health would permit, a whole day's fast or a half day's fast would be well worth considering.

Whatever discipline you choose, I would encourage you to craft a holy space of quiet apart from your daily quiet time or devotion time— 10, 15, 30 minutes as best works for you to focus on the cross through the Scriptures. Jesus gave his all for us; we can do a little more for Him.

Nothing can help you understand the love of God better than going daily to the cross of Jesus with an open Bible.

2. Take time to restore

How about being bold? Real bold! How about confronting your heart about prejudices, the refusal to forgive, the tendency to exaggerate when it comes to someone else's mistakes? And yes, that real deep aching pain and hurt that has not gone away or you have not allowed to go away? Well, that list can be long. Aren't we all truly human!

Now, I know some of us will find this a hard exercise. We've probably been hurt more than we could bear. There were words said that still hold a sting – even years later, maybe. Or like that dripping tap, the memories of the abuse and hurt keep disturbing the quiet in your soul – even after so long. Yes, it is hard. But honestly, following Jesus has its difficult parts to it. He is not one who hides things 'under the table'. In fact, as you read in the Gospels, he was willing to overturn those tables!

Through each week in Lent beginning on Ash Wednesday (1st March) till Easter Sunday (16th April) would you engage in the daily discipline of searching your heart? Get into the living area, the dining spaces, the basement and even the closets in your heart. Those places no one else is allowed into and no one else can see – but God. Pull out that vacuum cleaner and get off that dust that has settled like a permanent walk-way. Get that duster and clean up the dust. And look up and don't spare those entangling cobwebs.

Be honest. Cry. Talk. Kneel. Surrender. Allow the Holy Spirit to help you and the blood of Jesus to cleanse you. "Oh! What freedom!!!"

Nothing can heal your heart better than going daily to the cross with an open heart.

3. Take time to reach out

The cross is all about a God who reached out. Not because we invited him to, but because he invited himself to it! John the Gospel writer cannot be outdone for his declaration, “For God so loved the world that **He gave** his only begotten son....” John 3:16

God reached out at the cross. Look at him again. His body was broken so that we could be healed. His blood was shed, so that we could be forgiven. His arms were outstretched so that we could be welcomed. His tomb was empty so that we could be filled - with hope, new life and eternity.

What would you do this season to reach out?

Yes, some of you will help the children’s Sunday School in its efforts to support the Methodist Home that constantly cares for and touches young lives in need. Many of us will remember how our dear Louise Van Sickle served so passionately at the home.

Some of you will set aside money from little sacrifices you will make – be it an ice cream, a treat or a movie – and give that money in support of missions through the Bishop’s Partners in Mission boxes.

Many of you will make room for contributions through the “One great hour of sharing” as you assist the United Methodist Committee on relief to continue being “the hands and feet of Jesus” to those whose lives are hurt by disaster and troubles. Most of you have over the years made our missions support possible as a church by your generous and sacrificial Lenten mission support offerings.

God bless you for all you do. Thank you!!!

But here is a question for you. What MORE would Jesus want you to do? Would he want you to serve in the kitchen during the Men’s breakfasts? Would he want you to volunteer to help set meals for our new member’s classes? Would he want you to do to Downtown Daily Bread and serve? Or to Paxton Home? Or to just drive around the city as a small group and give gifts of blankets, warm clothes and a warm packed burger meal to someone who is homeless or in need? Some of you may rightly say that all those outings would not be possible on account of your health and limitations. Friend, is there a card you can write to someone you have never written to? A card to your Senators to encourage them in their work? A card to your Bank manager to say you are grateful for their services and that you send a prayer for them? A card to the person you hire to clean your property or clear snow or mow the lawn? A card to someone who is hurting and shut-in? And maybe some of you need to simply sit back and make calls. Calls to grandchildren, great grandchildren and your children. Calls that don’t just say “I love you”, but calls in which you dare to ask them how they are doing in their walk with God. Calls in which you can share from your life of how God has been real to you.

Nothing can make our world better than going daily to it with the love of the cross expressed by our open arms.

The United Methodist Church seeks to embrace and reflect the spirit of these oft-repeated words, “Open hearts, open minds, open doors.”

Be blessed this Lenten time my dear brothers and sisters, young people and children, as you keep your hearts, minds and doors open to God and his call to serve our world.

Grateful to each of you for your presence, prayers, partnership and encouragement in our journey together to higher ground.



When many of us hear the word “ratio”, we panic and think back to high school math classes. Some of us think about the ratio of gas and air an engine needs to run perfectly. Some of us think of the perfect amount of Kool-Aid powder to water to get that perfectly sweet glass of Kool-Aid. My life has been surrounded by ratios as a leader of youth events for the past several years. Often, when we do events, we shoot for a 5-1 ratio for students to leaders during an event. This provides the leaders with a small enough group to be able to have conversations with students and focus on relationships, but also allows for students to feel free enough to hang out with one another without having leaders looking over their shoulders during a typical Sunday evening Youth Group meeting.

This year, with the Trinity Youth Ministry, we are striving to completely flip that ratio on its head. Instead of having five students for every one leader, we want to have five leaders for every single student involved in our ministry. There is a very important reason we are doing this: we want students to have a faith that sticks with them! In Dr. Kara E. Powell and Dr. Chap Clark’s book “Sticky Faith”, they explained how having five different adult individuals from the church family developing a relationship with a student can dramatically and positively influence a student’s faith for the long-term. Our goal is to replicate this reality! We want to see students who have a faith that goes into the world after high school and does amazing things for the Kingdom. We want students who are passionate about faith!

Many people have asked me “How can we get involved?” One of the best ways to get involved in the ministry is by joining us on this endeavor as we seek to create this newly refreshed understanding of the “5-1” ratio. Maybe you are asking “how can I get involved”, “where does the youth ministry need leaders”, or “in what ways can I support the students, even though I may not be able to keep up with them with their games and regular programs”? This opportunity is the answer to your question! Reflections on Creation

March 2017

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being."

~ John 1:1-4 (NRSV)

On a recent trip to California, I saw the hand of God everywhere we went. I saw it in the magnificent Pacific Ocean, with its sparkling blue water rippling in the wind and endless waves crashing against the rocks. I saw it in the spouting and surfacing of huge gray whales who were migrating south. I saw it in the great variety of bushes, trees, cacti and flowers which had adapted to the sandy soil and arid climate, and in the comically large, colorful beak of a toucan at the zoo.

I saw the hand of God in the mountains, where erosion and wind revealed layers of long-buried history. I saw it in the desert, where I was dive-bombed by a fierce little hummingbird flashing his brilliant purple throat, letting me know I was too close to his territory. I saw it in a surprising palm oasis in a desert canyon, sheltering an unexpected waterfall and brilliant green ferns!

I saw the hand of God from my airplane seat, looking down at topography too strange and too familiar all at the same time. What I'm used to seeing in miniature was now duplicated in a super-sized fashion over hundreds of miles, evidence of wind and the power of water and time... Same creator, same forces of nature, just on a different scale - the all-encompassing touch of a powerful God who designed our beautiful earth as our home.

I definitely felt the hand of God helping us as we struggled to deal with a lost wallet. Someone who will not be named felt that it would be a grand idea to throw himself down from the peak of a sand dune in a vast area of dunes being pummeled by driving winds. After picking up more speed than he ever imagined, he had to sit for awhile to regain his equilibrium. (I don't think this is a recommended activity for those out of childhood...) When he returned to where we were waiting, I mentioned that I was glad to see he had not lost his hearing aids. (Impetuosity does not have time to worry about such things!) He reached for his wallet when we were about 40 miles away from the dunes and we were faced with a question: Did he even have it with him that day? Our son was driving. It seemed pointless to turn back, in light of the wind and the uncertainty of finding anything in such a huge area. Fast forward through hours of phone calls and emails to cancel and replace lost cards and ID and worries that he would not be allowed to fly home... to the day we got home, only to find a phone message from Al, an old friend who had gotten a strange call from California to say a wallet had been found and Al's was the only phone number in it...!! God has such a great sense of humor. My prayer had been that, on the off chance that someone found the wallet, they might be honest enough not to steal the identity or the cards would be illegible. Instead, the woman who found it wouldn't even take money out of it to ship it back to PA. What a wonderful answer to prayer, over and above what seemed probable! God is good, **all** the time.
