Trinity United Methodist Church is part of the West Shore Cluster of churches and we will be joining in the prayer chain for the cause during our slots between 2:00 -3:00 am and 2:00-3:00 pm on Sunday, May 7th. That very day, we will be including parts of the liturgy that has been shared for the occasion by the Susquehanna Conference in our worship services. I earnestly request each of you to regularly carry this matter in your prayers.



So now it is spring, glorious spring!! Last month we were heading to Florida, where it was definitely not Pennsylvania blizzard-like. My husband kept asking why we live in Pennsylvania. Of course, the answer is always family and familiarity and the path of least resistance. But in my gut, I just feel that here is where my path in life to walk is found. Yes, it was nice to see shore birds and unusual flowers and trees and swim in that clear, turquoise water in Florida... And luckily, by the time we returned most of the snow had receded. But I need more mystery in the topography than flat countryside affords and would not want to miss the unparalleled excitement of watching spring unfold here at home.

Riding around on our bikes on this perfect evening, I was charmed once again by the beauty of the translucent, unfurling leaves and the drifts of long ago-planted daffodils and narcissus found in old farmyards and sweetly-landscaped properties. Unfortunately, I often try to do too many of those things.... And get distracted by the seasonal chores which prevent me from truly being present as our gift is unwrapped. I hope to someday be smart enough to make a point of taking a stunning spring day and simply sitting in one place and saying "Yes, Lord, I receive this gift! Thank you for knocking our socks off with it every year!"


